



Bylaws Report October 2022

1. The Committee met on July 21st in attendance included:
Lori Pershon, Tammy Strunk, Christina Madriz, Mary Browning and Linda Webb
2. The Indiana Coalition For Patient-Centered Care bylaws were reviewed and no conflicts with IONL's bylaws were identified.
3. The current rules and regulations are accurate and were presented to the IONL board for approval.
4. The Bylaws Committee was asked to review a dual membership for state and district dues. Mary Browning reached out to the district presidents for feedback. Currently four of the seven active districts have dues and three do not collect dues. There was discussion about the accountability of use of funds and the need for standardization of reporting of each district to ensure compliance.
RECOMMENDATION: After discussion, a recommendation was made to the IONL Board to develop a sub-committee to conduct a detailed review of the risks, cons and benefits of combining state and district membership dues. The sub-committee should include, at least, all current district presidents, IONL treasurer, bylaws committee chairperson, IONL president and executive director.
5. No changes were recommended to the bylaws.
6. Current documents (bylaws and rules and regulations) are not in conflict with AONL or IHA stance.
7. District Bylaws – Seven of the eight districts have submitted bylaws for the committee to review.
